



## Webster Cellars 2013 Right Bank

### The Vintage:

2013, again we had great grape – sounds like the last harvest doesn't it? Well, if the grapes are great, so be it. It was a pretty spectacular year. The flavors that were produced will come through in this wine. The heat helped the fruit develop early here, we picked at peak ripeness, not over ripe, just right.

### Tasting Notes:

The color is deep and elegant, the tannins subtle. With 24 months in French oak, that's what you get. Entry is opulent with a strong mid-palate and round tannins that finish on your tongue, delighting it with a sense of surprise.

The nose is actually quite reminiscent of the Right Bank for which it is named, showing red fruit and a full oak character. I found a bounty of black currant, red berry, mahogany and hints of graphite and baking spices in this wonderful wine. The 24 months in French oak has succeeded in mellowing this hearty blend, providing a soft and lush texture and fine grained tannins. The wine is very well made, taking full advantage of the growing season to enhance this Bordeaux style blend.
